

SWITCH-Asia was **launched in 2007**. In 2023, the programmes entered into its **Phase III**.

The Programme in a nutshell



<u>Geo-coverage:</u> as of 2023, SWITCH-Asia covers 41 countries across Asia, the <u>Middle-East</u> (Yemen, Iran, Iraq) and the <u>Pacific</u> (12 SIDs, PNG, Timor Leste).

 Activities will progressively be extended to the M-E and PAC. HICs (JAP, ROK, SING, BRUNEI, AUS, NZ) are not eligible to the programme.



<u>Objective of the Programme:</u> support the transition of the region to a <u>low-carbon</u>, <u>resource efficient and circular economy</u>, whilst promoting more <u>sustainable supply chains</u> and <u>products</u> between the region and Europe.



<u>Economic sectors supported:</u> key polluting industries as well as export-led value chains in the region (e.g. food-systems, textiles and leather, plastics, sustainable tourism, constructions).











The Programme in a nutshell



EU policy alignment:

- External dimension of the EU Green Deal (e.g. Circular Economy Action Plan, Farm to Fork Strategy, EU Strategy for Sustainable Textiles, EU Plastics Strategy, Corporate Sustainable Due Diligence Directive, EU Sustainable Products Initiative, CBAM-if extended to relevant sectors)
- Global Gateway (supporting the integration and resilience of value chains between the Region and Europe)

Raising awareness of EU interests and values: including ensuring that supply chains of EU companies are aware about EU standards and norms (avoiding the disruption of value chains in the long term).



<u>Supporting Partner Countries:</u> supporting development of policies and industrial practices that lead to reducing the environmental and carbon footprints and comply with international agreements (e.g. Paris Agreement).




SWITCH-Asia – Implementing Structure

Objective: testing and uptake of SCP practices in MSMEs and by consumers



POLICY SUPPORT COMPONENT

The outcomes of projects will feed into policy dialogues, technical assistances and capacity building supported by this component

Objective: design & improve national / regional policies and regulatory frameworks, include industrial concerns into NDCs, facilitate discussions with FIs & investors to scale up sustainable practices in the region.



Policy Support Component

Period of implementation: 2023-2026

New: multi-country approach

Implemented by





- Objective 1: support the design of regional and national action plans on SCP and/or CE; the establishment of GPP systems; help governments in monitoring / reporting on SDG12.
- Objective 2: support governments in including SCP targets in their NDCs and comply with multilateral environmental and climate change-related agreements (e.g. Global Agreement on Plastics).
- Objective 3: support policy dialogues and strengthening relations between policy-makers and stakeholders in the EU and in the region.






Policy Areas Covered



Communication & Stakeholder Engagement

The programme generates SCP knowledge, widely shares it and develops strong relationships and networks with, among, and between partners.







Cooperation Opportunities – co-creation of ideas and practices



Knowledge exchange, co-development & identification of partners

Policy Dialogue and Events
